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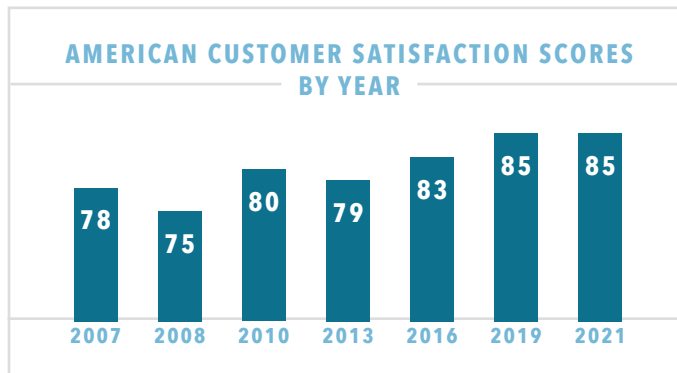
## SURVEY SAYS...

Every three years, Northeast Oklahoma Electric Cooperative (NOEC) participates in a member satisfaction survey conducted by our wholesale power supplier,

Associated Electric Cooperative Inc. The survey explores the current satisfaction of cooperative members while providing members the opportunity to critique our performance and evaluate our communication efforts. Our mission is to provide competitively-priced electric power and improve the quality of life of our members. We do that through communication efforts, educational programs, and best-in-class service.

The most recent survey was conducted in early November 2021. One important element of the survey includes the American Customer Satisfaction Index (ACSI). Cooperative members indexed NOEC at 85, the same index as the previous survey in 2019. The index is a proprietarily-modeled outcome of three questions on a scale of 0 to 100. The questions examine overall member satisfaction, an expectation question, and a question comparing each utility to the ideal utility. In the chart below, you can see how NOEC has been scored by its membership since 2007. By maintaining a steady ACSI index, our members have affirmed their satisfaction with the service provided to them.

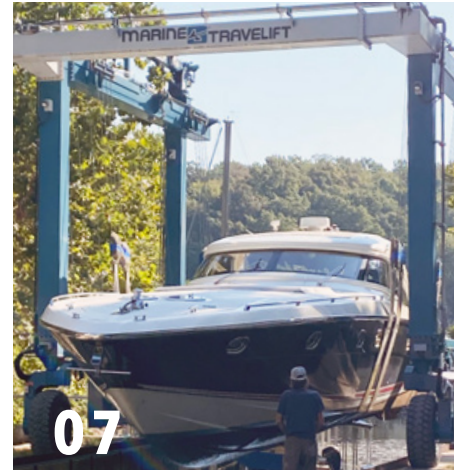

# .....SURVEY SAYS...

## CONTINUED FROM INSIDE FRONT COVER

### **Who was surveyed?**

You might be thinking that the survey was completed by only members of a specific group. This survey was conducted completely online and in a method that follows United States Census Bureau statistical data. For the area served by the cooperative, census data registers the population in each household. The number of people surveyed in the various age categories matches the percentage of population within the age group of that service area. In other words, if the census shows that 10.4 percent of the population is between ages 18 and 34, then 10.4 percent or more from that age category were surveyed.

### **Who are our members?**

The average NOEC member is between ages 45 and 64. Nearly half are married. More than 40 percent earn less than \$75,000 annually with 54 percent currently employed. In 2019, the average member was slightly younger but still within the 45 to 64 age range. Also in 2019, there was a higher percentage earning less than \$75,000 annually. Fifty-three percent earned less than \$75,000 with 52 percent employed during that time.

### **Are you really satisfied?**

When asked about your overall satisfaction with the cooperative, you responded as “very satisfied.” More than 71 percent ranked NOEC at a 9 or 10 on a 10-point scale. And for that we say “thank you.” We know we are not perfect, but our employees work very hard every day to exceed your expectations. Nearly 62 percent grade the cooperative as “very close to the ideal utility.” That type of praise provides our teams that extra “nudge” to continue focusing on becoming a best-in-class electric cooperative.

### **It's just a start**

This survey is only the beginning. It lays the foundation for NOEC's strategic plan. In the cooperative's short-term strategy—focused on the next five years—your perspective defines focal points where the operational areas of the cooperative will set sights for improvement. Member perspectives form the fiscal outlook that help the cooperative meet margin and loan requirements while balancing other financial metrics. Analyzing and improving internal processes are key to providing increased member satisfaction and becoming a best-in-class cooperative. To meet strategic goals, we must have the right people and technology in place while retaining the values upon which the cooperative was built some 85 years ago.

**It takes a village and we have nearly 190 dedicated team members working in concert for this machine called Northeast Oklahoma Electric Cooperative with the objective of delivering competitively-priced electric power to you.**

## ELECTRICAL SAFETY CHECKLIST

**Take a few minutes to identify and correct potential electrical hazards in your home. If you can answer "yes" to any of these questions, you may have a potential hazard on your hands.**

### Switches & Outlets

Are any switches or outlets warm to the touch? *This could indicate an unsafe wiring condition.*

Are any outlets or switches discolored? *A discoloration could indicate a dangerous heat build up at a connection.*

Do plugs fit snugly into outlets? *Loose plugs can cause overheating and fires.*

### Cords

Are any cords cracked, frayed, or damaged? *Damaged cords can expose wires, resulting in shock or fire.*

Are any cords pinched by furniture or windows, or attached to anything using staples or nails? *Pinched or stapled cords could have damaged insulation, creating the potential for shock or fire.*

Do you use extension cords on a permanent basis? *Extension cords should only be used temporarily.*

### Electric Panel

Do you have recurring tripped breakers or blown fuses? *This could mean you are exceeding a safe level of electric current.*

## TIPS & TRICKS

### ENERGY EFFICIENCY

#### Checking for Air Infiltration In Your Home

On a windy day, tape narrow strips of tissue paper where you suspect air may be entering your home. The more the strip moves the more severe the infiltration. Be aware that operating appliances and ceiling fans can make the strips move. Use appropriate material such as caulk, spray foam, or backer rod to fill gaps. You will probably be more comfortable and save money too.

Examples of places to tape tissue strips are: baseboards, around windows, threshold seals of doors, outlet and switch plates, attic entrances, window air conditioners and fireplaces/chimneys. Note: air infiltration is a double-edged sword since conditioned air inside the home can escape through the same gaps as the outside air enters. Filling gaps stops both. ## **GIVING TOPS \$100,000 IN 2021**

### **It's Operation Round-Up**

## **DONOR APPRECIATION MONTH**

**We'd like to give a shout-out to those of you have been with us since the beginning and invite others to join the cause.**

### **What is Operation Round-Up?**

Operation Round-Up is a benevolent program generated by voluntary monthly contributions from participating members of Northeast Oklahoma Electric Cooperative.

### **How does it work?**

NOEC members participate by allowing their monthly electric bills to be rounded up to the next dollar. For example, a bill of \$82.63 would be rounded up to an even \$83.00 dollars with the additional 37 cents going to Operation Round-Up.

### **How much would I be giving?**

The average member contribution is 50 cents per month or \$6 per year.

### **Where does the money go?**

Monthly member contributions are placed in a trust administered by an independent board of directors. This trust is known as the Northeast Oklahoma Electric Cooperative Foundation, Inc. The foundation board consists of one designee from each of the cooperative's nine districts. These designees are community leaders who serve the foundation on a voluntary basis. The foundation board receives and evaluates all requests, determines who receives funding and how all Operation Round-Up monies will be disbursed. Funding is typically used to address crucial community needs such as emergency equipment, food bank, and backpack program supplies—but is not limited to these categories. The foundation board meets every other month to disburse funds.



### Small Change That Changes Lives

It may just be the easiest giving you'll ever do. Allowing your electric bill to be rounded up to the nearest dollar for charity may not sound like much of a splash in the philanthropy department, but when you combine those pennies with the pennies from thousands of other people, that small splash becomes a cannonball—a cannonball of goodwill.

During that time, \$3,556,281.30 has been allocated to needy causes throughout its service territory of Craig, Mayes, Delaware, Ottawa and Rogers counties. Some of you have been with us since the beginning. More than 300 electric co-ops across the U.S. have since adopted Operation Round-Up as a way to positively impact the communities where they serve.

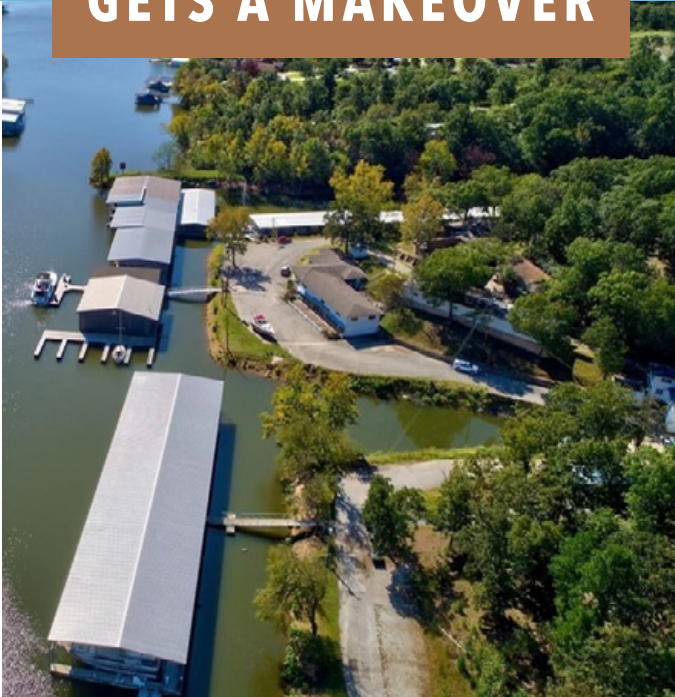

# UNDER NEW OWNERSHIP

## ONE OF GRAND LAKE'S ORIGINAL ANCHORAGES

### GETS A MAKEOVER



Scissortail Marina opened its doors in 2021, but by the time the 2022 lake season rolls around, patrons may have a difficult time recognizing the place.

**The marina facility formerly known as Port Carlos was purchased in mid-April of last year by the husband and wife team of Dan and Ann Frenette. The Frenettes came in with a lengthy to-do list and hit the ground running after taking the helm. They've applied considerable elbow grease to renovations, many of which have taken place during the off-season.**

The Frenettes' investment in one of Grand Lake's oldest marinas has not gone unnoticed. "Almost every building on the property now has a new roof and new paint," Ann confirmed.

A thorough round of pressure washing removed years of moss, grime, and cobwebs from exposed exterior structures such as docks, slips, and the stone walls that surround the marina. However, the improvements extended beyond the merely cosmetic. All heating and air-conditioning systems have also been repaired or replaced.

"There is painting, repairs, upgrading, cleaning, and all kinds of improvements happening on any given day here at the marina," she said.

Conveniently situated in Sawmill Hollow, Scissortail is a full-service marina that offers quick access to and from the south end of the main lake. As longtime patrons have known and new customers are now discovering, Scissortail Marina is the perfect spot to fuel up—and stock up—before heading out for a day of fun on the water.



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**"We are so happy to be in this beautiful, calm water cove where we are surrounded by beautiful rolling hills and lush, natural scenery," Ann said.**

"Our ship store carries essential supplies such as fuel, fuel stabilizer, boat batteries, and personal watercraft batteries," Ann explained. "We are also stocked with life jackets and vests, clothing, flip flops, sunglasses, cover ups, swim suits, beer, wine, ice, and snacks."

She said the marina is also a proud retailer of Gail Force saddles and floats, as well as Orca cups and ice chests.

"Honestly, we have almost anything you need for a day on the lake," said Ann.

The ship store at Scissortail Marina is open Wednesday through Sunday in season from 9:30 a.m. until 5:30 p.m.

**"We want customers to know someone will actually be here when they need gas," she said. "Of course, they can also come in and grab beer or whatever else they need."**

The marina is equally accessible by land, which is an important feature to keep in mind with the much-anticipated opening of Cadillac Jack's restaurant this spring. The indoor restaurant space is being remodeled. An adjoining covered outdoor dining area already has a new roof. Ann said courtesy slips are available for those planning on visiting the restaurant by boat.

Slips are also available for rent at Scissortail. The marina can accommodate boats of all sizes and features more than fifty slips ranging in size from 26 to 64 feet in length with lifts for the 26 to 30-foot slips. There is currently a waiting list for the larger slips.

**"We are located in a quiet cove that is well protected from wind and waves," she said. "We have a gas dock, our Wi-Fi is free, and pump-outs are provided."**



## ABOUT THE OWNERS

Dan and Ann Frenette are transplants from Canada's east coast by way of two Oklahoma cities. The Frenettes first landed in Lawton, Oklahoma, where they both worked for a paper manufacturer. When a promotion opportunity came up for Dan, the Frenettes relocated to Wagoner while he ran a paper plant in nearby Pryor. They also spent considerable time at a second home on a bluff overlooking Grand Lake. With retirement looming, Dan wanted to have something to keep him busy for years to come. That's how they came to purchase the 23-acre property formerly known as Port Carlos. While Dan finishes up his career in Pryor as plant manager, Ann came out of retirement and is now holding down the fort at the lake. She is handling the day-to-day operations as marina manager at Scissortail, and Dan pitches in to help out on evenings and weekends. The Frenettes have also been remodeling their new home on the marina grounds.

## Congratulations!

The Frenettes both celebrated their dreams of becoming naturalized American citizens in February of 2021. Congratulations Dan and Ann!





Ann added: "Your boats are looked after as if they were our own. The safety of your property is important to us. There is one road in and out, and the owners—us—live on the property."

The most important feature of Scissortail Marina may be its heralded service department. Be it winterization, mechanical or fiberglass repair, or a bottom job, the marina's full-service boat repair facility is open year-round, Monday through Friday from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. to meet customer needs.

Most unique, perhaps, is the marina's travel crane—the largest lift of its kind on the lake.

"We can lift almost any boat out of the water," Ann said. "We also have a fully-enclosed, heated dock shop. It's a drive-in with two slips and large roll-up doors on the water side for boats that can stay on the water for service."

Now is a great time to make an appointment for service and prepare your boat for spring. New equipment and upgraded tools have been added to guarantee better service for your boat. Plus, Scissortail employees have over 60 years of repair and customer service experience.

Explained Ann: "Gary Stuart and Scott Barr are still here running the service department. Gary is an amazing diagnostician and Scott specializes in repairs. James Lescysnski was hired as a mechanic's assistance and handles maintenance and bottom jobs."



**"Our vision is to provide a clean, comfortable, updated marina to complement quality, personalized customer service," Ann said. "We want each of our guests to leave here with great memories of Grand Lake."**

Sam Conner manages the ship store and heads up renovations and improvements during the low season. Rounding out the Scissortail staff are office manager Anna Marie Davidson whose service, according to Ann "is second to none," and seasonal dock hand Maddox Mathews.

"We are grateful for our team's expertise," she said. "Without them, none of this would be possible."

Ann added: "The Scissortail Marina family is committed to providing quality customer service. We will continue to improve and grow every aspect of our operations."

# FEATURED RECIPES

## CELEBRATE ST. PATRICK'S DAY



**Prep Time:** 15 mins

**Cook Time:** 2 hrs 45 mins

**Serves:** 8

### CORNER BEEF

#### MAIN DISH

#### INGREDIENTS

- 4 lb corned beef brisket
- Water to cover
- 1 medium head cabbage, cored and cut into 6 wedges
- 12 small red potatoes, halved
- 1 lb small white onions, peeled
- 6 large carrots, peeled and cut in chunks

#### SAUCE

- 1 tbsp unsalted butter
- 2 tbsp all-purpose flour
- 1 tbsp red wine vinegar
- 1/2 cup reduced-fat sour cream
- 2 tbsp coarse Dijon mustard

about 1 minute. Add reserved cooking liquid and vinegar to butter-flour mixture; cook, stirring frequently, until sauce is slightly thickened, about 4 minutes. Remove saucepan from heat and whisk sour cream and mustard into sauce. Serve sauce alongside corned beef and vegetables.

**Step 1:** Place corned beef in a 6-quart Dutch oven or heavy pot and pour in enough water to cover beef by 2 inches. Bring water to a boil, skimming the liquid occasionally to remove fat from top. Reduce heat to medium-low, cover Dutch oven with a lid, and simmer for 2 hours.

**Step 2:** Arrange cabbage, potatoes, onions, and carrots around beef and return liquid to a boil. Lower heat to medium-low, cover Dutch oven, and simmer until vegetables are tender, about 40 minutes. Transfer beef to a serving platter, reserving 1 1/2 cups cooking liquid. Surround meat with the vegetables.

**Step 3:** Melt butter in a small saucepan over medium heat. Whisk flour into melted butter until dissolved and bubbling,

## ROASTED GARLIC CABBAGE

### SIDE DISH

#### INGREDIENTS

- 1 head cabbage
- 1 1/2 tsp olive oil
- 3 cloves garlic, smashed
- 1 tsp kosher salt
- 1 tsp pepper

**Step 1:** Cut cabbage into 1" thick slices and rub both sides of slices with smashed garlic.

**Step 2:** Use a pastry brush to apply olive oil to both sides of slices. Season with salt and pepper.

**Step 3:** Bake at 400° F on top rack for 30 minutes, then flip and cook for an additional 30 minutes until browned and crispy.

**Cook Time:** 50 mins

## IRISH SODA BREAD

### SIDE DISH

#### INGREDIENTS

- 4 cups all-purpose flour
- 4 tbsp white sugar
- 1 tsp baking soda
- 1 tbsp baking powder
- 1/2 tsp salt
- 1/2 cup margarine, softened
- 1 cup buttermilk
- 1 egg

#### BUTTER MIXTURE

- 1/4 cup butter, melted
- 1/4 cup buttermilk

**Step 1:** Preheat oven to 375° F. Lightly grease a large baking sheet.

**Step 2:** In a large bowl, mix together flour, sugar, baking soda, baking powder, salt and margarine. Stir in 1 cup of buttermilk and egg. Turn dough out onto a lightly floured surface and knead slightly. Form dough into a round and place on prepared baking sheet. In a small bowl, combine melted butter with 1/4 cup buttermilk; brush loaf with this mixture. Use a sharp knife to cut an 'X' into the top of the loaf.

**Step 3:** Bake in preheated oven until a toothpick inserted into the center of the loaf comes out clean, 45 to 50 minutes. Check for doneness after 30 minutes. You may continue to brush the loaf with the butter mixture while it bakes.



# UNCLAIMED DOLLARS COULD BE YOURS

**Northeast Oklahoma Electric Cooperative members are entitled to a portion of any profit made by the company. As approved by the NOEC board of trustees, refund checks were mailed to members in September 2021. These checks represented the following patronage capital retirement:**

- 100% of remaining unretired patronage from 1988 totaling \$412,475
- 50% of 1989 patronage totaling \$310,866
- 9.59% of 2020 patronage totaling \$494,289
- Estate closings totaling \$151,000

Checks totaling \$10 or more were mailed to eligible members. Checks were not mailed to members whose patronage capital accounts totaled less than \$10. These accounts will continue to accumulate funds with each retirement. When an account reaches \$10 or more, a check will be issued following the next retirement. NOEC makes every effort to ensure members receive patronage capital that is rightfully theirs. To accomplish this, it is important for NOEC to have your current mailing address. Checks are often returned marked "undeliverable." Many of these do not have the correct 911 address. A partial listing of unclaimed checks is provided at right.
